Huawei e303 unlocker 2013 v1.000 This software is specifically designed to be used with Huawei E303 cellphones, but should also work with many other Android-powered phones as well as those running Windows Mobile or Symbian. The latest version of this software supports Android versions 2.2 through 4.2 and Version 8 of Windows Mobile, so it should have no trouble working for most devices that use these operating systems. The unlocker does not require installation and has a simple interface that allows you to quickly enter a phone serial number and then choose your country from a drop-down menu in order to find out which model you'll need the unlocker for in order to successfully enter into service mode (iBoot mode). In order to use this software, you will need a data cable that has a serial debugging modem built into it. You can find a list of cables that meet these requirements on the Unlockboot website. If you do not have a cable with the correct connections, you can purchase one from Unlockboot for \$11.00 – just be sure to select "Cable Only" as your shipping method and enter code ECBDW1 as well as your email address when checking out (don't include the quotes). This unlocker is free to those who already own an e303 or those who want to buy 8 different models for \$10 each (full price) or 12 models for \$8 each (discounted price). You can download the unlocker and instructions by clicking the "Mirror" link in this article and installing it in your phone with a file browser like File Manager or Explorer. Once you've installed the software, insert your SIM card and wait for the program to finish loading. When it does, select your model from the drop-down menu on the main screen (you will need to scroll down to find the model number if it is not listed) and click on "Ok". Then, connect your phone to your computer using a cable with a serial debugging modem built into it. You will see a screen like the one below where you can enter your email address and your country (which you can find out by checking out this article on Unlockboot.com), and then you should be able to enter iBoot mode so that you can access other modes on your phone. Once in iBoot mode, the software should give you a prompt for an "unlock bootloader". You can find instructions to unlock the bootloader of the device here, but those do require that you already have an unlocked bootloader on your device as well as a custom recovery installed using tools such as BLINK or TWRP. You can also find instructions to enter iBoot mode using hardware keys or the application "iBoot Exploit" (requires Windows 7). If you want to unlock iBoot mode without entering it through an application, follow these instructions (they are quite long): 1. Start your device in bootloader mode. 2. Put your phone back in its charger until it turns off. 3. Hold down volume up+home+power at the same time while turning on your phone. 4. Within seconds, you should see a 'reboot' message with some text that looks like this: "HBOOT
